
Association of Southeast Asian Nations

- 8 August 1967 in Bangkok, Thailand, with the signing of the ASEAN Declaration (Bangkok Declaration)
- Founding Fathers of ASEAN: 5 Foreign Ministers Adam Malik (Indonesia), Fidel V. Ramos (Philippines), Tun Abdul Razak (Malaysia), S. Rajaratnam (Singapore) and Thanat Khoman (Thailand)

ASEAN FDI

A World Class Investment Destination

ASEAN attracted

US\$136 billion

in FDI in 2014, accounting for 11% of global FDI inflows, up from only 5% in 2007

ASEAN Connectivity

A More Connected Community

Annual tourist arrivals were up from 62 million in 2007 to 105 million in 2014, almost half of which were intra-ASEAN

The rate of Internet subscription more than doubled from 11.8 per 100 inhabitants in 2007 to 28.6 in 2014

ASEAN Aims and Purposes

(Bangkok Declaration 1967)

- To accelerate the economic growth, social progress and cultural development in the region through joint endeavors
- To promote regional peace and stability through abiding respect for justice and the rule of law





ASEAN + 3

The ASEAN+3 cooperation process started in December 1997 during an informal summit among the ASEAN leaders and China, Japan, and the Republic of Korea.









The cooperation focuses on political security, sustainable development, sociocultural development, economic and finance cooperation.

\$708.6 BILLION

Total trade between ASEAN and China, Japan, and South Korea in 2015, accounting for 31.1 percent of the region's total trade.

\$31 BILLION

or 26 percent of the total FDI inflow to ASEAN is the foreign direct investment (FDI) from the three trading partners.



ASEAN + 6

ASEAN+6 intends to accelerate economic growth in East Asian countries, promote cooperation in energy, foods, and other fields vital to economic activities, and in other ways greatly benefit Japan and the region's other countries.





East Asia Summit

- The East Asia Summit (EAS) is a meeting of 18 regional leaders for strategic dialogue and cooperation on the key political, security, and economic challenges facing the Indo-Pacific region.
- The EAS comprises the ten member states of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) – Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, and Vietnam – plus Australia, China, Japan, India, New Zealand, the Republic of Korea, Russia and the United States.
- The EAS's 18 members represent around 55% of the world's population and account for 55% of global GDP.
- The EAS is an ASEAN-centred forum; it can only be chaired by an ASEAN member.



East Asian Community



- "yu-ai." translated as "fraternity."
- Within "yu-ai," people respect the freedom and human dignity of others just as they respect their own freedom and human dignity.
- In other words, "yu-ai" means not only the independence of people but also their coexistence.

 - China-Centered Tribunal system (Pre-Modern)
 - Imperialism (Modern)
 - Cold-War Fragmentation (Post WWII)

- Economic Diversity
 - Advanced
 - Developing
 - Underdeveloped

East Asian Community

- "a bona de regional community with shared challenges, common aspirations, and a parallel destiny." -East Asian Vision Group in "Towards an East Asian Community, ASEAN+3 Leaders Brunei Darussalam in November 2001.
- primary criterion of inclusion should be shared economic interests and the willingness and ability of members to contribute to the region's security, stability and prosperity. - - Rajiv Sikri, ISAS
- A reasonably compact rather than a sprawling body;
- All members to be equal, without any concentric circles;
- An open and inclusive body that does not exclude any power with legitimate interests in the region;
- An ASEAN-centric body that would bring in countries that are summit-level Dialogue Partners of ASEAN, whether on an annual or periodic basis.

Hatoyama's East Asian Community

- cooperate to prosper together
- cooperate to save a "Green Asia."
- cooperate to protect human lives.



Challenges to Building an East Asian Community

- question of threat
- question of disparities among the member countries of ASEAN
- need to intensify functional cooperation
- capacity building and human resource development
- question of existing institutions such as ASEAN, ASEAN+3, the APEC and the ASEM
- important element of the United States



ASEAN + 3

East Asian Community

- peace, prosperity and progress
- based on cooperation and openness
- seek to expand understanding, agreement, and coordination among regional countries on important international issues with a view to enhance the ability to contribute to what is good not only to the region, but to the world
