

PRESENTATION AND OBJECTIVES

The congress provides a forum for academic, scientists and early careers to discuss the role of non-Arctic Member States in developing a European Arctic policy and roadmap; contributing to the action of the European Union as a unitarian actor. Following the call for papers issued last January, the congress will focus on several key issues related to the influence and committment of the European Union in the Arctic, mainly sustainable development and governance, security and the protection and promotion of lifestyle of Indigenous Peoples.

Its main objectives are the creation of debate among scientists, policy- makers and stakeholders on issues that constitute the structure of a comprehensive and integrated European Arctic Policy. Therefore, the initiative will be an opportunity to discuss the perspectives, proposals and interests of all European non- Arctic countries in the region.

Finally, the congress aims at promoting the presentations and participation of early career scientists through the presentation of their contributions, giving an insight on innovative proposals on Arctic matters and European related policies.
