OBJETIVES

The Inter-University Master's Degree offers advanced training in the study of Antiquity oriented towards specialisation in three areas of knowledge: the Ancient East and Egypt, Greece and the pre-Roman Mediterranean, and Rome and Roman Hispania. The main objective is to offer specialised knowledge in these three areas of study to provide students with the methodology, techniques and instruments of analysis and historiographical criticism necessary to deal with the documentation of the ancient world and, in short, with rigorous research activity. It also aims to make students reflect on the survival and influence of antiquity and its study in the subsequent historical evolution up to the present day. Therefore, it not only offers advanced knowledge of literary, archaeological, and epigraphic historical sources, but also an approach to their preservation as heritage in museums, archives, libraries and private collections, where the compulsory internships of the Master are carried out.

PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS

This Master's Degree is mainly aimed at graduates in History, Archaeology and Classical Philology. However, it is also open to graduates in other disciplines of the Humanities and Social Sciences, as long as they can demonstrate a solid prior knowledge of Classical and Oriental Antiquity through their academic transcript or curriculum vitae. Candidates should also have an average knowledge of written comprehension in English and Spanish.

WHY STUDY THIS MASTER'S DEGREE?

As an inter-university degree, in conjunction with the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid (UAM), it offers the best teaching team in Spain specialised in Antiquity, which allows for the exceptional fact of offering three specialisations.

As a result, it offers the best teaching offer that can prepare students to start a PhD programme in Antiquity. This comprehensive training also qualifies graduates to work in the cultural and publishing industry, and in cultural and research institutions dedicated to the recovery and enhancement of historical, documentary, and bibliographic heritage. Lectures are given in Spanish.

STRUCTURE

The Master's Degree consists of 60 ECTS structured into modules and subjects:

- Module 1. History and Heritage of Antiquity. 20 compulsory ECTS (4 subjects of 5 ECTS)

Optional Speciality Modules. 29 ECTS electives

- Module 2. Ancient East and Egypt
- Module 3. Greece and the Pre-Roman Mediterranean
- Module 4. Ancient Rome and Hispania
- Internship: 5 compulsory ECTS
- Master's Thesis: 6 compulsory ECTS.

Three specialisations are offered: Specialisation in the Ancient East and Egypt; Specialisation in Greece and the Pre-Roman Mediterranean and Ancient Rome and Hispania.

Regarding the 29 optional ECTS, students who wish to opt for a specialisation will have to take at least 2 subjects of 5 ECTS, corresponding to History subjects, and 2 subjects of 4.5 ECTS, corresponding to Antiquity Sciences subjects, from the same specialisation module. It is possible not to choose a specialisation, but it is still compulsory to take 2 subjects from History subjects and 2 from Antiquity Science subjects.
