Complutense The Institute for International Studies (ICEI), a leading center of research and investigation which cover a wide range of topics related to Globalization, is organizing a Summer School on the Economic and Political effects of New Technologies – ICT's, that

We will also provide attenders with a methodological program on "Networking Analysis" and an in depth lecture on Voting Advise Application (VAA) and electoral platforms. The main purpose of the Summer School program is to synthesize and integrate the main challenges, potential, limitations and opportunities that ICTs can provide in the current socio-economic international scenario. Therefore, the program combines lecture session, mainly on e-politics and e-economy, and practical sessions mainly focused on social network analysis and related methodologies.

The professors and teaching staff are leaders in their fields in different universities, mainly in Europe. Some of them, are also leading personalities of international organizations or social movements, all of them experts in trending topics linking ICTs and Governance.

Lectures are delivered in English.

## Prices and course options

For those not being able to attend the two-week program, oneweek is also available. In this case, the first week will focus on ICT's and Politics (22-27<sup>th</sup> June); the second on ICT's and Economy (29<sup>th</sup> June- 3<sup>rd</sup> July). The people attending the Summer School will have lodging and breakfast included (1350€ two week course; 790€ one week course). Those that prefer the Networking Analysis I and II, will attend two methodological workshops over the two weeks (including four nights of lodging and breakfast, prized 520€)

#### ✓ *E-governance*:

The use of the ICTs in society by different social, economic and political actors, has radically changed the way governance is done in the XXIst Century. Several dimensions of nowadays democracy have been radically altered because of the existence of new means for participating, receiving information, debating and deciding. The public administrations have also developed new means for communicating with the citizens, even the voting system have been transformed.

#### ✓ Power and Agency in New and Social Media:

New tools have been the basis for ICTs aided communities to emerge. They have introduced new qualities to the traditional communication. How are these changes affecting the power relationships and the capability of each individual to act independently and make their own choices?

#### Digital Social Movements:

How are the ICTs affecting the way social movements behave? Social movements are facing the challenge to adapt to a new communication environment, thus affecting their traditional organizational, communicational and , in general, their means of action

## ✓ Round Table ICTS and Politics:

Political representatives sent by some of the most relevant political parties in Spain, both the traditional and the emerging (PP, PSOE, Podemos, Partido X, Ciudadanos), will discuss how the ICTs are affecting politics in Spain and in Europe

#### ✓ E-journalism:

Journalism as a profession and the art of making newspapers have been one of the fastest changing due to the influence of ICTs. This talk focuses on approaching these changes in a systematic way, so that these changes can be understood and used in order to improve social communication.

## Applied political research: Analyzing data from Voting Advise Applications

This session, quite technical, focuses on the Voting Advice Applications (VAAs) is intended to help voters identify which parties are closer to their own preferences. For these applications to be reliable, some requisites have to be fulfilled in order to guarantee their accuracy of lack of important biases. Some platforms will be analyzed and used by the participants.

#### Ciberactivism, Tecnopolitics and r-evolution:

The use of ICTs for internal dynamics inside social movements is combined with an analysis of the new tools, means of action, that social movements are developing. These new repertoires, do they substitute or add up to the ones typical of the old style? A ciberactivist will share with us her practice: mobilization through the internet using different means.

## Collaborative Networking in Action:

The network culture develop through the social means of communication, is changing the way entrepreneurs relate to each other. Cooperative social network are become quite common. In this event, a practical session of networking will take place, offering the opportunity to live how networking is done, both using success and failure stories.

## ✓ Social Network Analysis (I and II):

Participants will acquire the skills for using the trending methodology called Social Network Analysis, explained step by step by and academic expert.

#### ✓ ICTs & Business:

ICTs have influenced the way businesses relate to all of their interest groups (customers, b2b, providers, Public Sector). This talk focuses on identifying the way ICTs are changing the life of businesses.

## *Digital Entrepreneurship:*

Linked to the idea of Digital Economy, the EU is focusing on the different technologies that are expected to boost the European Economy, bringing to the Digital Entrepreneurship: mobile and social solutions, cloud computing, data analytics are some of the new features offering new opportunities to the new ways to be entrepreneur.

## ✓ ICTs & Finance (Crowdfunding) and Round Table on Crowdfunding

Crowdfunding has emerged as a new means to start new businesses. Instead of a few people, putting a lot of money; many people, putting little money. Due to this new means to gather money for new projects, derive from social initiatives and not from the State, new ideas can find their way and become a reality.

## Visit to an innovation Living Lab: Empowerment and Innovation using ICTs in LLs.

Living Labs have become an extended reality all over Europe. A living Lab will be visited, making it possible to understand the differences of a LL with regards of other spaces of experimentations. Living Lab will also allow methodologies, empowerment and other features of innovation trends to be explored and experimented.

## ✓ ICTs & Environment. The Life of Electronics:

The expansion of ICTs in daily political, social, economic life, implies facing also new challenges. What is the life expectancy of electronics? What to do with them when they are no longer useful?
