MALMÖ UNIVERSITY & THE CITY OF MALMÖ

- Founded in 1998
- 24 400 students, 1 800 employees
- Five multidisciplinary faculties
- Offers 100 programmes and 350 single courses. 20 programmes taught in English
- 2/3 of Malmö University's students are female
- 1/3 of the students have a foreign background
- 2/3 of the students are first generation academics
- Core values:
 Diversity, Creativity, Quality &
 Commitment to the community



- Sweden's third biggest city with a population of around 315,000.
- Culturally diverse city with 170 nationalities.
- Average age group is 36 years.

In the population group 25-64 years, 46% of Malmö residents have a higher education.

Previously a traditional industrial city, now characterised by entrepreneurship and a skilled workforce.

Linked with Copenhagen and the rest of Europe via the Öresund Bridge.







A UNIVERSITY PRIORITY

One of four prioritised areas for 2016 is to develop the global attraction of Malmö University by increasing the diversity among the staff and by "aiming at recognizing foreign academics' competence".


To do this we build on existing structures such as "the students lifecycle".

EDUCATION

Language courses

- From beginners to required level, language test,
- Tailor-made courses: Swedish for pedagogues

Regular education

- Refugees are accepted to full program/course or to later part of programs
- LOOCs
- Discussions on how to include themes as democracy and values in all educations



COMPLEMENTARY EDUCATION – REGULAR OR CONTRACT EDUCATION

- Validation and assessment
- Recognition of prior learning incl. competences, skills and experiences
- "Fill the gap": Add only what's needed to reach the identified target in the new context
- Individual plans of study
- Work together with the employers for workplace education Teachers, Administrators, Engineers
- Short track: complimentary teacher education in Arabic and Swedish
- Completion must mean various thing



COLLABORATION BETWEEN UNIVERSITIES - NATIONAL AND REGIONAL LEVEL

- Simplify for the individual: "one-stop-shop"
- Complement each other rather than compete
- Specialization
- Learn from each other
- Support and shared responsibilities
- Joint development projects:



COLLABORATION WITH OTHER AUTHORITIES

The Swedish Migration Board, the County Administrative Board, The Employment services, Municipalities, NGOs

- To be involved early in the establishment process
- Swedish for immigrants for Academics at universities
