From March 29th to June 28th

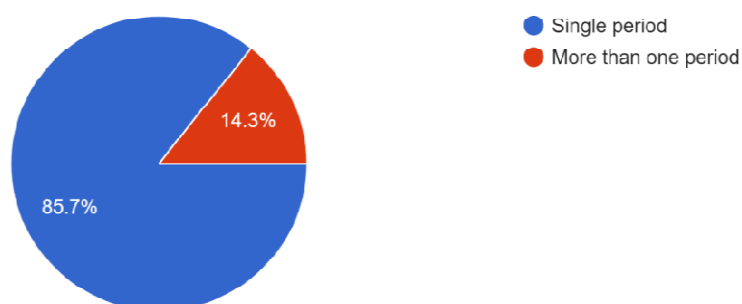

From September to December

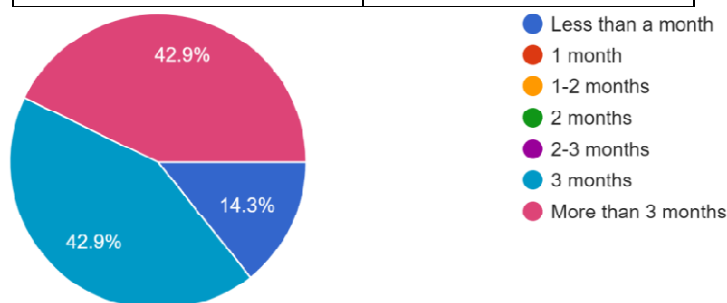

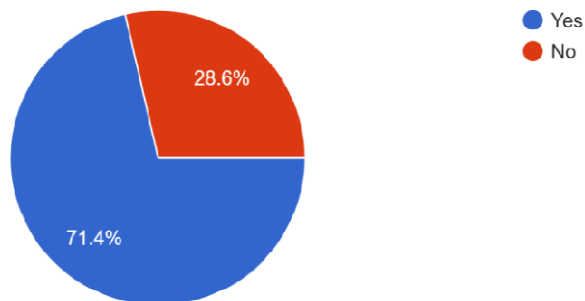

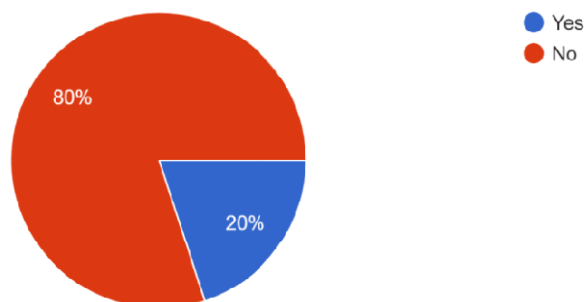

#### 6. Did you get a mobility grant?

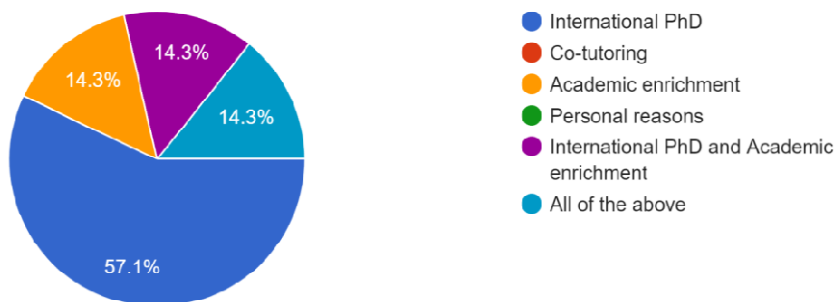


#### 7. If you received one, was the grant enough to pay for accommodation, transport and living expenses?

#### 8. Reasons to carry out the mobility



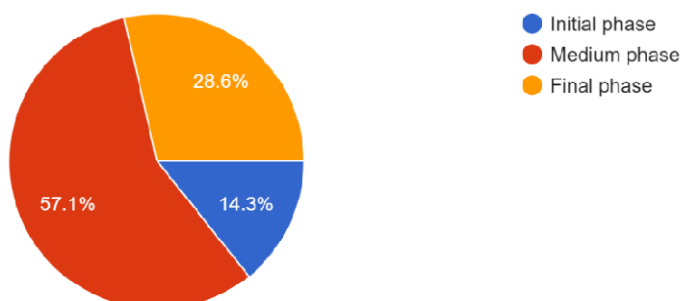
