

European Health Insurance Card

- This card is compulsory for Erasmus students (except for ICM KA107 students, who must take out a Private Health Insurance for the whole duration of their stay).
- ☐ The Spanish National Health System:
 - Free of charge for Erasmus Students (Private Health Insurance holders to consult HI company about the health centers and doctors assigned for medical assistance).
 - Healthcare Centres (family medicine, paediatrics and nursing)
 - Hospitals are all over the country but you'll need to be referred by a doctor for any hospital treatment.
 - Medicines prescribed by doctors must be purchased in pharmacies and will have the same discounts as Spanish residents.
- **Emergency** telephone: **112** (no area code needed)







Entry and stay in Spain as an European student: information about legal requirements

Central Register of Foreign Nationals

European citizens that will stay in Spain more than 3 months must register with the **Registro Central de Extranjeros**

What documents do I need?

- 1. Official form (EX-18), two copies, filled and signed by the UE national
- 2. Copy of the passport or other identity document (not expired)
- 3. Copy of the European Health Insurance Card or any other proof of private health.
- 4. Erasmus accreditation
- Fee: 10,78€ (it must be paid before the issue of the certificate). MODELO 790, CÓDIGO 052.
 OPTION 5: Certificado de registro de residente comunitario

Application Period: no later than **3 months** after arriving to Spain.




The Student House. The Centre for students and their associations, with a permanent presence in many different academic professional and personal areas.


