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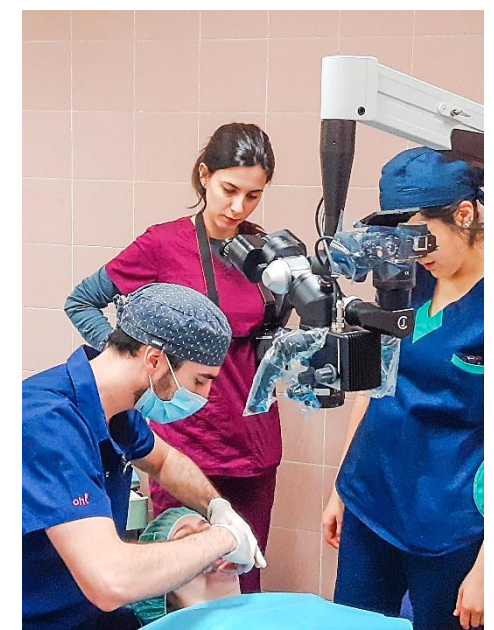

PROGRAM

The program is organized in three full-time years (6 semesters – 40 weeks/year) comprising 180 European Credits (ECTS). The academic content leading to an Academic Master Degree will be 110 ECTS, including the Research Presentation. The Specialty Certificate can only be obtained after completing both the Academic Degree and the required clinical training and achievement of competences and proficiencies (70 ECTS). Both the Academic Degree and the Specialty Certificate are inter-linked in such a manner that one cannot be obtained without the other.

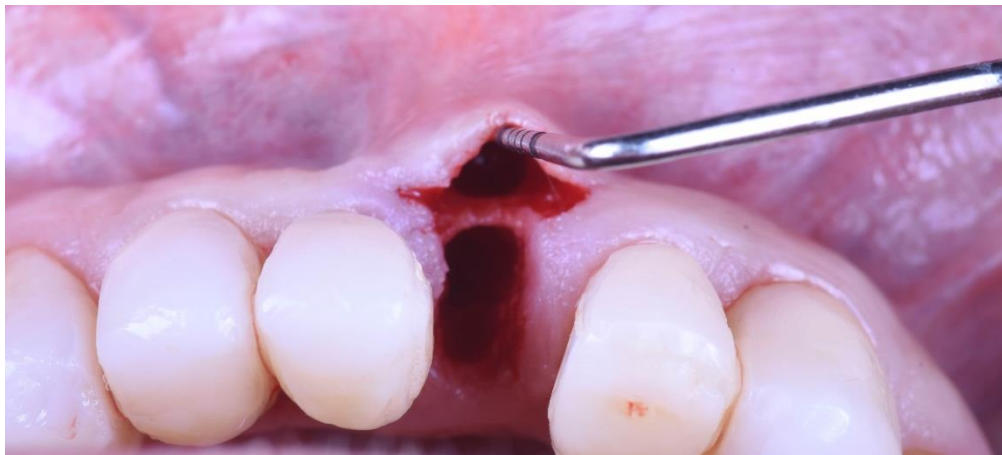

Achievement of competences and proficiencies in advanced periodontics and surgical implant dentistry is our main objective, but this must be coupled with developing skills in clinical and basic research, critical thinking and appreciation to the detail and excellence.

This program combines learning in both basic and clinical sciences through taught courses, literature seminars, clinical sessions and treatment planning seminars.

This program includes the realization of a research project with the presentation of a formal research report at the final examination.



DURATION

This is a 3-year full-time academic program running from September 15th to July 15th (40 weeks/year; 38 h/week). Students average clinical performance is about 100 periodontal surgeries (including mucogingival and regenerative) and more than 50 surgically placed dental implants. All clinical cases are planned multidisciplinary with the departments of prosthetics, conservative dentistry and/or orthodontics.



ENTRANCE CRITERIA

Entrance to the Program will be done through an examination and if needed a personal interview. The exam will consist in two parts, one covering Periodontology and Implant Dentistry at dental undergraduate level and the other on research methodology and biostatistics applied to Periodontology. Only those who fulfil the following criteria will be allowed to participate at the entrance examination.

Admittance Criteria

1. Be in possession of an internationally valid degree in Dentistry.
2. Previous experience in general Dentistry of at least one year.
3. Postgraduate academic training in research methodology and biostatistics (those possessing this training should demonstrate equivalence to the Oral Science Master offered by UCM)
4. Be in possession of at least two letters of recommendation.
5. Be fluent in both English and Spanish (for those applicants whose mother language is not Spanish). TOEFL certification of at least 85 and DELE level C are the required minimum for language proficiency.
6. An important positive criterium for entrance is the previous direct relation with our postgraduate program. This can be achieved by carrying out a formal stay of 3-months participating in the postgraduate course "Expert in Clinical Periodontology" (information can be obtained at the <http://www.ucm.es>).

Similar positive criteria are having previous research experience or relevant professional activities in the field of Periodontology Those students fulfilling these criteria and willing to apply must submit their application during the first two weeks of May, together with the required documents, curriculum vitae and the letters of recommendation.



TEACHERS

Teaching staff includes full time, part time and invited teachers. More than 50 teachers and instructors are involved in the didactic and clinical learning process.
