# 1. Foreword

These guidelines explain the submission process for the Pasqual Maragall Foundation–Alzheimer's Association Alzheimer's Disease and Alzheimer's Disease Related Dementias Fellows Program (FPM–ALZ AD/ADRD) Fellows Program 2026 Call.

Application to the FPM–ALZ AD/ADRD Fellows Program is via a two-stage application process: submission of a Letter of Intent (LOI) followed by the submission of a Full Proposal upon invitation.

The whole process of application, review and selection of projects will be carried out in English therefore all information must be submitted in English.

Applications must be made via the [online grants system](#).

All applications must be approved by the Organisation Manager of the Host Institution before the submission deadline. We strongly recommend that researchers wishing to apply to the FPM–ALZ AD/ADRD Fellows Program 2026 Call contact their Research Management/Pre-Award Offices as soon as possible so that they can ensure that there is an active Organisation Manager profile for their Host Institution. It will not be possible to submit an application if the Organisation Manager and organisation profiles have not been validated by us.

Please read the Request for Applications carefully before starting your application and refer to this Submission Guidelines document when completing it.

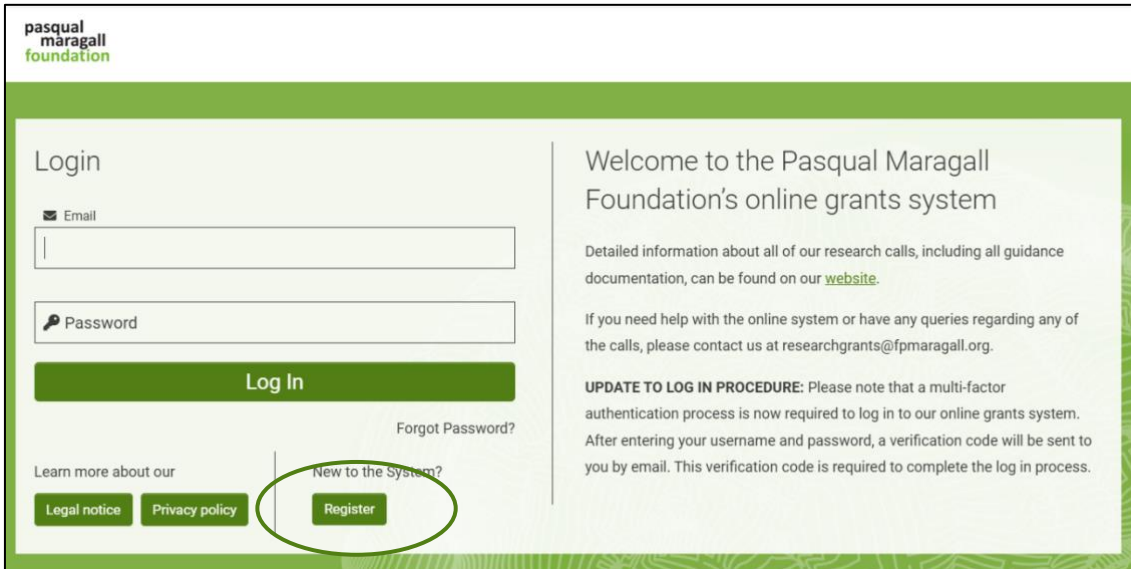

## 2. Registration and Accreditation

### Process

In order to submit an application to the FPM–ALZ AD/ADRD Fellows Program 2026 Call, it is necessary to have a user account for the online grants system.

If you have not yet registered for the online grants system, please click on the green Register button and then select from the options of Researcher and Organisation Manager.

- Researcher: the Principal Investigator (PI) who will be responsible for the submission of the Letter of Intent (LOI).
- Organisation Manager: the individual appointed by an organisation's legal representative to be responsible for the management of the organisation's profile and the approval of applications on the online grants system. This could be, for example, the Head of the Research Management or Grants Office.

Please note that **it is not possible for an Organisation to have more than one Organisation Manager.**

## 2.1. Researcher

After selecting the option Researcher, you will be directed to the registration page. All user accounts must be linked to an organisation therefore the first thing you will be asked for is the name of your organisation. Please note that this is the organisation that will be invited to sign the Grant Agreement with the Pasqual Maragall Foundation and Alzheimer's Association if your application is eventually selected for funding. As you start typing, the system will suggest possible matches. If your organisation appears, please click on it. Please note that the system has been prepopulated with organisation names therefore it is possible that your organisation will appear even if no other member of your organisation has registered for the online grants system yet.

If you cannot find your organisation, you will need to select the option “click here” to add it. In order to add your organisation, you will only be required to provide your organisation's legal name and fiscal identification number (NIF). Please note that only one organisation name can be assigned to each NIF. The country field is automatically set to Spain because only organisations based in Spain can be Host Institutions in our research calls.

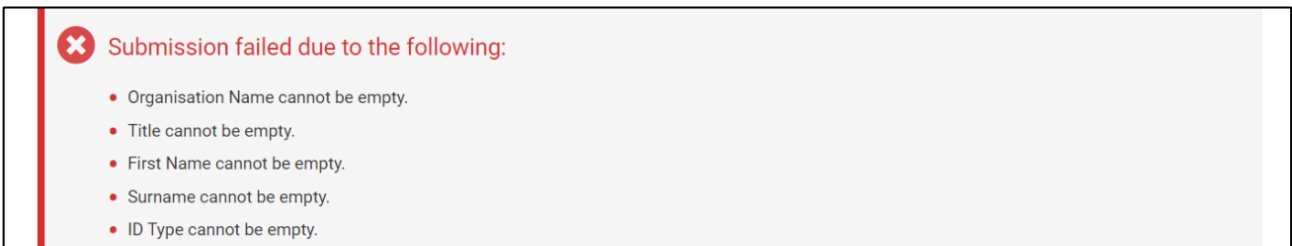

After selecting or adding your organisation, you will be required to complete the “Researcher Information” section of the registration form.

The registration form is self-explanatory but please keep in mind the following points:

- **Single registration:** as a general rule, an individual may only register for the online grants system once. It is not permitted to create multiple accounts using different email addresses. In case of exceptional circumstances, please contact us for advice on how to proceed.
- **Year PhD Awarded:** this is a mandatory field because all applicants must be in possession of a doctoral degree. If you do not have a PhD, you are ineligible to submit an application to this Call and therefore cannot register for the online grants system as a researcher.
- **Email:** We recommend the use of a professional rather than a personal email address. All communications about the Call and the status of your application will be sent to this address.

After completing all of the required fields, you may submit your registration form. If validation errors are detected, these will be displayed at the top of the page below the instructions:



If you click on the validation error, you will be directed to the relevant field. All validation errors must be resolved in order to submit the registration form.

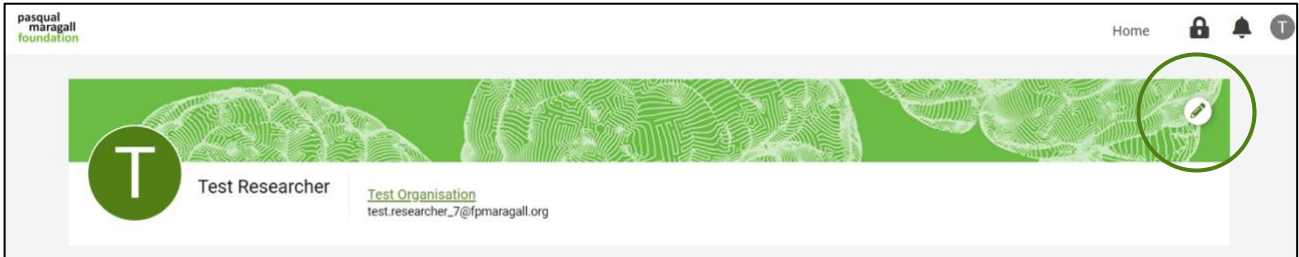
If another organisation with the same VAT number already exists in the system, this will be detected. In this case, an alert message will appear on screen to let you know.

Please check again to see if you can find your organisation. Remember that it should be registered with its legal name. If you still cannot find your organisation, please contact us ([researchgrants@fpmaragall.org](mailto:researchgrants@fpmaragall.org)) and we will help you to resolve this issue.

After submitting your registration form, you will receive an email with a link to create your password. After setting your password you will be able to log in to the online grants system and start your application (please see section 3).

Please note that there are various fields in the application form that are completed automatically with information from your profile. If you need to update your profile, you can do so by clicking the pencil

in the top right corner of your homepage. After updating your profile, the relevant information in the application form will be updated automatically.



If you need to update the organisation linked to your profile, please contact us ([researchgrants@fpmaragall.org](mailto:researchgrants@fpmaragall.org)).

**IMPORTANT:** We recommend that you contact your Research Management/Pre-Award Office as soon as possible to let them know that you would like to apply to the FPM–ALZ AD/ARD Fellows Program 2026 Call. They will need to manage the registration and accreditation process for the Organisation Manager and Organisation if this has not yet been done. You will be unable to submit your application unless the Organisation Manager and organisation profiles have both been validated by us.

## 2.2. Organisation Manager

After selecting the option Organisation Manager (OM), you will be directed to the registration page. All user accounts must be linked to an organisation therefore the first thing you will be asked for is the name of your organisation. As you start typing, the system will suggest possible matches.

If your organisation appears, please click on it. Please note that the system has been prepopulated with organisation names therefore it is possible that your organisation will appear even if no other member of your organisation has registered for the online grants system yet. Only one organisation name can be assigned to each NIF. If the name of your organisation needs to be corrected, you will be able to update it after your Organisation Manager profile has been validated by us.


If you cannot find your organisation, you will need to select the option “click here” to add it. You will see that the country field is automatically set to Spain because only organisations based in Spain are required to have an OM for our research calls.

After selecting or adding your organisation, you will be required to complete the “Organisation Manager Information” section of the registration form.

The registration form is self-explanatory but please keep in mind the following points:

- Single registration: as a general rule, an individual may only register for the online grants system once. It is not permitted to create multiple accounts using different email addresses. In case of exceptional circumstances, please contact us for advice on how to proceed.
- Email: We recommend the use of a professional rather than a personal email address. In addition, we recommend that Organisation Manager accounts are created using a generic department email address. All communications about the status of your organisation’s applications will be sent to this address.

After completing all of the required fields, you may submit your registration form. If validation errors are detected, these will be displayed at the top of the page below the instructions:



**Submission failed due to the following:**

- Organisation Name cannot be empty.
- Title cannot be empty.
- First Name cannot be empty.
- Surname cannot be empty.
- ID Type cannot be empty.

If you click on the validation error, you will be directed to the relevant field. All validation errors must be resolved in order to submit the registration form.

If another organisation with the same VAT number already exists in the system, this will be detected. In this case, an alert message will appear on screen to let you know.

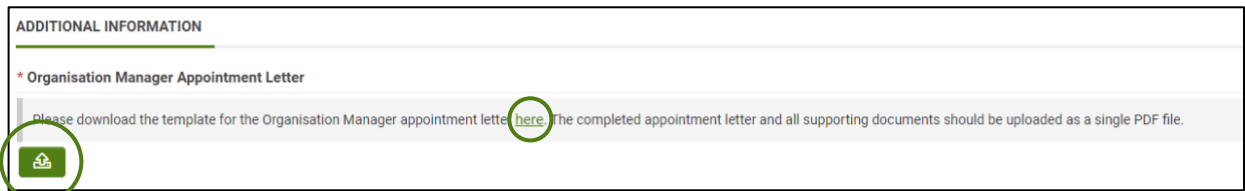
Please check again to see if you can find your organisation. Remember that it should be registered with its legal name. If you still cannot find your organisation, please contact us ([researchgrants@fpmaragall.org](mailto:researchgrants@fpmaragall.org)) and we will help you to resolve this issue.

After submitting your registration form, you will receive an email with a link to create your password. After setting your password you will be able to log in to the online grants system and complete your profile. Until your personal profile is validated, you will be unable to access your organisation's profile.

You can access your profile by clicking the pencil in the top right corner of your homepage.



Please download the template for the Organisation Manager Appointment Letter from the Additional Information section of your profile. Once completed, it should be uploaded to the OM profile together with the required supporting documentation as one PDF file.



The supporting documentation required to be presented with the Organisation Manager Appointment Letter is as follows:

- Legal document proving the identity of the organisation manager (copy of valid ID or Passport).
- Legal document proving the identity of the legal representative (copy of valid ID or Passport).
- Legal document proving that the legal representative is authorised to sign on behalf of the organisation.

Once your profile is complete, please submit it for review. You will receive updates via email regarding the status of your accreditation as OM. If more information is required in order to validate your OM profile, you will also be contacted by email. As all applications need to be approved by the OM of the Host Institution and approvals can only be done by a validated OM, please ensure that this process is completed as quickly as possible.

Once your profile as OM is validated by us, you will be able to access and edit your organisation's profile.

Please note that researchers from your organisation can start their application at any time. However, applications cannot be submitted if the OM and organisation profiles have not been validated. The profiles should therefore be submitted for review as soon as possible.

## 2.2.1. Organisation Manager Renewal of Organisation Manager Profile

Organisation Managers are required to renew their profiles annually. They will receive an email with instructions on how to proceed. If no changes are required, this can simply be confirmed and then their profile is renewed directly. If changes are required, these need to be submitted for our review.

## 2.3. Organisation

Only a validated Organisation Manager can edit the Organisation profile. They must complete the organisation's profile and upload the following documentation:

- Official document showing the Fiscal Identification Number (NIF) of the organisation.
- Official document showing the registration of the organisation in the corresponding registry.
- Articles of Association.
- By-Laws.

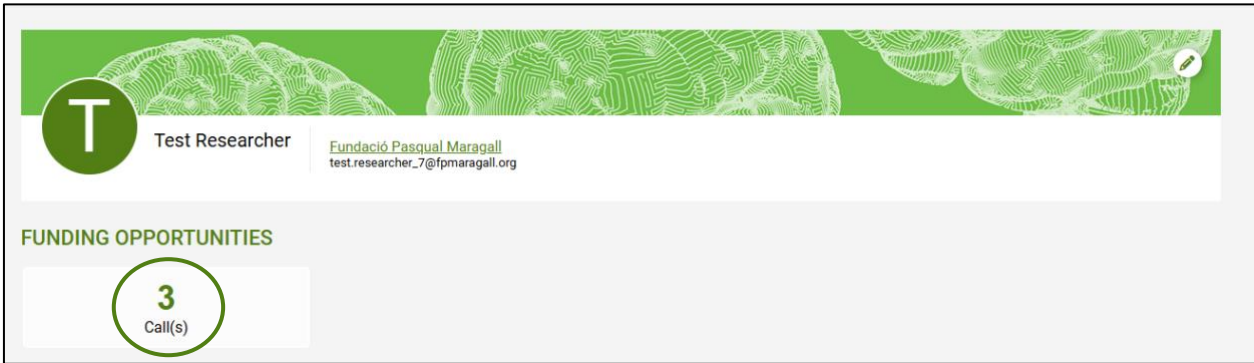
Once the organisation profile is complete, please submit it for review. The OM will receive updates via email regarding the status of the accreditation of the organisation. If more information is required in order to validate the organisation, the OM will also be contacted by email. As mentioned previously, researchers can start their application at any time. However, they will be unable to submit their application if the OM and organisation profiles have not been validated. For this reason, we recommend that the process is completed as quickly as possible.

### 2.3.1. Renewal of Organisation Profile

An Organisation Manager is required to renew their organisation's profile annually. They will receive an email with instructions on how to proceed. If no changes are required, this can simply be confirmed and then the organisation profile is renewed directly. If changes are required, these need to be submitted for our review.

### 3. Starting an Application

To start your application, please click on the section Call(s) that can be found under the Funding Opportunities heading.



Under the FPM–ALZ AD/ADRD Fellows Program, please click the Apply Now button.

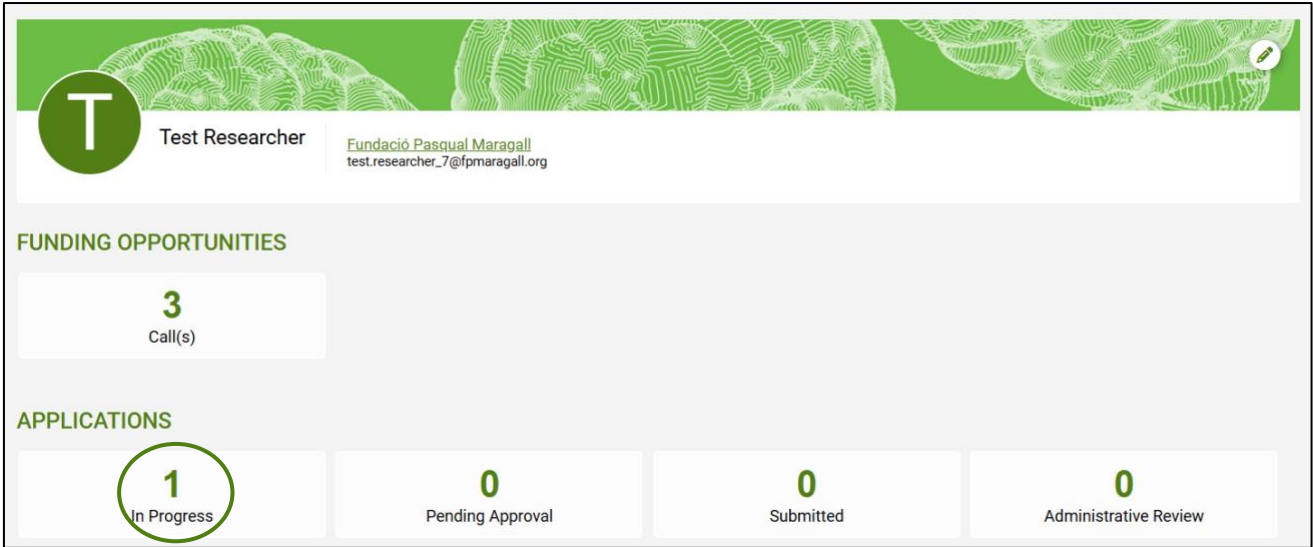
The FPM–ALZ AD/ADRD Fellows Program 2026 Call will fund, with up to €400,000, research projects that are executed within a maximum period of four years.

When you log back in to your account you will be able to access the application by clicking on the In Progress section under the Applications heading.



Prior to completion of the LOI online, some brief questions must be answered as part of an initial eligibility check. It is the responsibility of the applicant to answer these questions correctly. A full eligibility check will be carried out by the Funders following receipt of the submitted LOI.

After selecting yes or no from the dropdown menu for each question, the applicant should click Save Draft to generate the result of their eligibility quiz. The “correct” (eligible) answer to each question is not always yes. Please note that after clicking Save Draft for the first time, one previously hidden question will appear (“Are you in possession of a doctoral degree (PhD) that you obtained no more than 15 years ago?”). The answer to this question is completed automatically according to the information provided in the user’s profile and cannot be edited.

Depending on their answers, the applicant will see a message stating that they appear or do not appear to be eligible to submit a proposal. In the case that it appears that they might not be eligible, a message stating that according to their answer, they seem to be ineligible to submit an application will appear underneath the relevant question(s). Answers can still be modified at this stage. If this is done, then Save Draft should be clicked again. Once the applicant wants to submit the eligibility quiz they should click Continue. Submission is still possible even if the warning message shows. However, please note that a full eligibility check will be carried out following LOI submission and any ineligible applications will be excluded. After submitting the quiz, answers can no longer be modified.

The eligibility quiz will be hidden from the online form when the result was positive. However, applicants who appear not to be eligible will still be able to see the result of their eligibility quiz.

## 4. *Letter of Intent (LOI)*

The Letter of Intent (LOI) consists of an online form, and a narrative CV document that must be downloaded, completed and uploaded to the online grants system.

The LOI online form has the following tabs:

- Application Information
- Project Information
- Budget
- Project Overview
- Publications
- Track Record
- Declarations

The information requested is explained in sections 4.1 to 4.7 of this document.

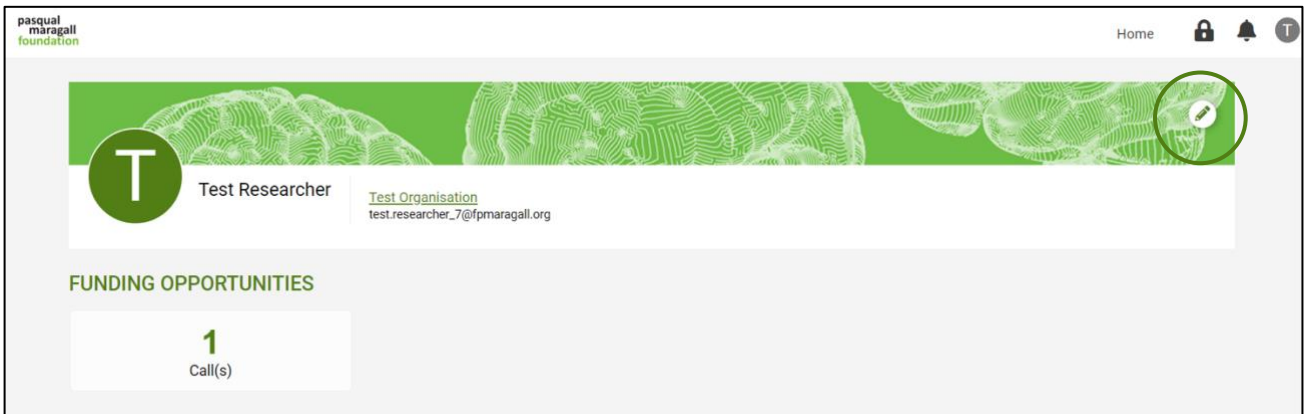
Some general information that may be useful for the applicant:

- The Validate button can be used at any time to detect validation errors that would stop the application from being submitted.
- As a general rule, clicking on the Pasqual Maragall Foundation logo in the top left corner of the page is a quick way to return to the homepage.
- At the top of the application form, there is a green LOI Summary button that generates a PDF of the application.
- In the Project Information, Project Overview and Track Record tabs, the size of the text boxes can be changed by clicking on the bottom right corner.

## 4.1. Application Information

Applicants do not need to enter any information in this tab. All fields are completed automatically using the profile information.

To update a user profile, click the pencil in the top right corner of the homepage. After updating the profile, the information in the application form will be updated automatically.



## 4.2. Project Information

In the Project Information tab, the applicant is asked to provide the following information about the research project proposed:

- Project title
- Project acronym
- Project duration (between 24 and 48 months)
- Type of research (translational or clinical)
- Research topic (and secondary research topic if applicable)
- Medical Subject Heading (MeSH) keywords (between five and ten)
- Other keywords (maximum of five)
- Publishable lay summary (maximum of 1,500 characters including spaces)
- Scientific abstract (maximum of 2,500 characters including spaces)

If the applicant selects “Other” as the research topic or secondary research topic, they will be asked to specify which topic. This option should only be selected if they have previously communicated this topic to us ([researchgrants@fpmaragall.org](mailto:researchgrants@fpmaragall.org)).

The applicant should be sure to include the disease(s) that the proposal focuses on as MeSH keywords.

The topics and keywords provided by the applicant are important because they will be used to select evaluators for the LOI.

### 4.3. Budget

No detailed budget breakdown is required at the LOI stage. In the Budget tab, the applicant must simply indicate the total budget that they would like to request.

Please note that at Full Proposal stage this figure should only be modified in special circumstances and modifications are not expected to be substantial. Applicants will be asked to provide an explanation for any change. A maximum of €400,000 can be requested.

### 4.4. Project Overview

In the Project Overview tab, the applicant is asked to provide the following information about the research project proposed (the character limit always includes spaces):

- Does your project plan include the ALFA study?
- Background (maximum of 1,500 characters).
- Specific aims of the project (maximum of 1,500 characters).
- Brief project description, including methodology (maximum of 2,000 characters).
- Novelty of the project (maximum of 2,000 characters).
- Impact of the Project (maximum of 2,000 characters).

Please note that if the project plan includes the ALFA study, the applicant must include a detailed explanation in the “Brief project description, including methodology” section and they will be asked to complete an Excel to indicate the data/samples they would like to access (template available on the online grants system).

## 4.5. Publications

In the Publications tab, the applicant must add their publications related to the proposed research project. Up to ten publications can be added.

To add a publication, the applicant should click the + Add Publication button.

**i** Please list a **maximum of ten (10) of your peer-reviewed publications related to the proposed research project**

- Please click the **+Add Publication button** to add new publications.
- After adding them, please click **Save Draft** to see them displayed below.
- If you have to **edit or delete** any of the publications, click the **Edit Publications** button.

Publications can be added manually by entering the following information:

- Publication Title
- Author List
- Journal
- Publication Date
- Digital Object Identifier (DOI)
- Impact/significance of the publication (maximum of 500 characters including spaces)

Alternatively, the applicant may search for publications from PubMed by clicking on the Tools button and selecting Publication Search:

The Publication Search Tool allows the applicant to search for publications from PubMed by completing any of the information on the form (title, author, dates, keywords) and clicking on Search to retrieve the matches. Publications may also be found using their Digital Object Identifier (DOI) when this is entered as a search term in the keywords field.

After clicking Search, the applicant will see a list of results. The publication(s) should be selected by ticking the box to the left of the publication details then added by clicking the green + button.

The applicant must then provide a brief text (maximum of 500 characters including spaces) explaining the impact/significance of the publication. It is possible to edit this text later if required.

To complete the process, the Create Transaction button must be clicked.

## 4.6. Track Record

The Track Record tab captures information necessary to evaluate the track record of the applicant.

Some fields in the Track Record tab are completed automatically using the profile information (Year of PhD, ORCID, Current position...). In addition, the following information is requested:

- PhD certificate (to verify eligibility)
- Extension to doctoral degree eligibility period requested (if applicable)
- Narrative CV
- Significant research grants

### 4.6.1. Extension to doctoral degree eligibility period

As detailed in the Request for Applications, the eligibility period for applicants to have obtained their doctoral degree (PhD) may be extended beyond 15 years in certain circumstances. If an extension is requested, applicants are asked to indicate the period and upload supporting documentation to support the request.

The table below summarises the circumstances, the applicable extension periods, and the documentation that must be uploaded to support the extension request in each case.

Circumstance	Extension to doctoral degree (PhD) eligibility period	Supporting documentation required
<b>Maternity</b>	Eligibility period extended by 18 months per child born since the doctoral degree was obtained. If the leave taken was longer than 18 months, the extension will be for the actual duration of time taken as leave. The same applies for child adoption.	Birth certificate or similar official document evidencing the date of birth of each child. In addition, if an extension of more than 18 months per child is requested, a document evidencing the actual leave period taken is required.
<b>Paternity leave</b>	Actual duration of time taken as paternity leave since the doctoral degree was obtained. The same applies for child adoption.	An official document evidencing the actual leave period taken.
<b>Long-term (over 90 days) illness</b>	Actual period of sick leave or compassionate leave taken to care for a seriously ill close family member since the doctoral degree was obtained.	An official document evidencing the actual leave period taken.
<b>Other exceptional circumstances</b>	Considered on a case-by-case basis. If you think your circumstances may warrant an extension of the doctoral degree eligibility period, please contact us for advice before applying.	To be determined by the Funders according to the specific circumstance.

## 4.6.2. Narrative CV

The applicant should download the template for the narrative CV. Once completed, the narrative CV needs to be converted to PDF then uploaded to the online grants system.

The Narrative CV Template has the following sections:

- Personal details
- Personal statement
- How have you contributed to the generation of ideas or knowledge?
- How have you contributed to the development of others and the maintenance of effective working relationships?
- How have you contributed to the wider research and innovation community?
- How have you contributed to broader audiences and towards wider social benefit?
- Additional information (optional)

Details on what information is required in each section are provided in the template available on the online grants system.

The narrative CV must not be more than five pages. Applicants may determine how much space to allocate to each section. The optional additional information section does not count towards the five-page limit but cannot be used to detail additional qualifications, examples of contributions etc.

Please note that the following rules apply to the narrative CV document:

- **Font:** Times New Roman, Arial and Calibri
- **Font size:** at least 11 points
- **Line spacing:** at least single line

## 4.6.3. Research Grants

In this section of the track record tab, the applicant may add a maximum of five research grants. At least one of the five projects must be a competitive research grant (excluding mentored and training grants) that is active at the LOI submission deadline to demonstrate the applicant's eligibility to submit an application to the Call.

The following information is required for each research grant:

- Project Title
- Funding Body (dropdown menu with the option of Other if required)
- Call
- Project start date
- Project end date
- Role (Coordinator, Work Package Leader or Principal Investigator)
- Currency (EUR, GBP, USD)
- Budget Allocation (budget allocated to the applicant's research team)
- Total Project Budget (total project budget – for individual projects, this will be the same as the budget allocation)
- Brief Project Description

If the grant was not awarded in EUR, GBP or USD, please convert the budget to one of these currencies.

After all of the information has been entered, please click Save Draft to save the information. Then click Submit to validate the information. At this point any errors will be detected. These errors must all be resolved in order to successfully submit the research grant. If each research grant is not submitted, the applicant will see a validation error when they try to submit the application.

## 4.7. Declarations

In this tab, the applicant is asked to confirm that:

- they fulfil all eligibility criteria.
- the application has been fully completed.
- all information presented is correct to the best of their knowledge.
- they have read and accept the conditions of the current call detailed in the Request for Applications.

The Organisation Manager is also required to complete declarations but this is done after the LOI is submitted by the applicant.

## 4.8. Submission

When the applicant tries to submit the application, any validation errors detected will be displayed at the top of the page. By clicking on the validation error, the applicant will be directed to the relevant field. All validation errors must be resolved in order to submit the LOI. For this reason, it is advisable to use the Validate button regularly in order to detect errors in a timely manner and allow time for them to be resolved before the submission deadline.

Following submission by the applicant, the Organisation Manager will be notified by email that an application requires their approval. If the OM considers that changes are required to the LOI before it can be submitted, they can request for updates to be made. In this case, the applicant will be notified by email. After the requested changes are made, the applicant can resubmit the application for OM approval. This process can be repeated as many times as necessary.

As only one user can have edit access to an application at a time, it is important that the applicant does not have the application open after submission. Otherwise, the application will appear as checked out by another user and the OM will be unable to proceed.

**IMPORTANT:** The OM must approve the application before the LOI submission deadline.

### 4.8.1. Organisation Manager Approval

The Organisation Manager (OM) is notified by email when a researcher linked to their organisation submits an application. The OM reviews the application but cannot edit it. The OM can decide to proceed with submission of the LOI or request changes.

If the OM chooses to proceed, they must complete the Organisation Manager declarations listed below then click the button Proceed with LOI Submission.

Organisation Managers are asked to confirm that:

- the host institution meets all eligibility criteria.
- the applicant meets all eligibility criteria.
- the host institution will support the applicant throughout the life of the project.
- the host institution accepts the conditions of the current call detailed in the Request for Applications.

To request changes, the OM must complete the text box in the Organisation Manager tab then click the LOI Changes Needed button. The information included in the text box is then sent to the applicant by email and the status of the application returns to In Progress.

As mentioned previously, only one user can have edit access to an application at a time. If the buttons Proceed with LOI Submission and LOI Changes Needed are not visible, it is possible that the applicant may still have the application open. This can be confirmed by checking the bottom of the page to see if the following message appears: **“This record is locked. Checked out by another user”**.

The OM should contact the applicant directly to resolve this issue. However, in case of technical difficulties, please do not hesitate to contact us at [researchgrants@fpmaragall.org](mailto:researchgrants@fpmaragall.org).

## 4.8.2. Application Statuses

The applicant will be contacted by email to keep them updated regarding the progress of their application. In addition, when the applicant logs in to their account, they will be able to check the status of their application according to the section in which it appears.
